- Letter No. KSCBC:MS/Reports/2000-01 Dated: 14-12-2000 of the Member Secretary Karnataka State Commission for Backward Classes.

#### Preamble:

In Govt. Order Dated: 17-09-94 read (1) above, Govt. have formulated reservation policy for Schedule Casts and Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes for admissions to professional courses for the year 1994-95 as per the lists of castes enclosed thereto as follows:

CATEGORY-I	4%
CATEGORY-II (A)	15%
CATEGORY-II (B)	4%
CATEGORY-III (A)	4%
CATEGORY-III (B)	5%
SCHEDULED CASTES	15%
SCHEDULED TRIBES	3%

- 2. Under the said order Dated: 17-09-94 it has also been stated that no person other than belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Category-I of Backward Classes shall be entitled to the benefit of reservation for admission to professional courses unless he/she satisfies the conditions of the creamy layer specified there under.
- 3. In G.O. Dated: 31-01-1995 reat at Sl. No. 2 above, the aforesaid reservation and creamy layer policy envisaged in the order Dated: 17-09-94 read at Sl. No. (1), has been made applicable to the employment too, under Article 16(4) of the Constitution of India.
- In G.O. Dated: 14-02-96 read at SI. No. (3) above the Creamy Layer Policy existed as on 01-01-95 for the purpose of admission to the professional courses was also made applicable to employment with retrospective effect from 01-01-94.
- 5. In Writ Petition No. 438/94 the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India have passed an interim order stating that the reservation in any case should not exceed 50%. Similar writs bearing No. 417/94, and 694/94 are pending disposal before the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Therefore, in G.O. No. SWD 61 BCA 95 Dated: 28-12-95 the currency of the 50% reservation specified in G.O. Dated: 17-09-94 and 13-01-95 has been extended till the final decision in WP No. 438/94, 471/94 and 694/94 is taken by Hon'ble Supreme Court.
- 6. Now the Karnataka State Commission for Backward Classes have submitted special report and 71 advices vide their letter Dated: 04-12-2000 read at Sl. No. 4 above. Pending consideration of the entire report, the Government have examined in detail the Creamy Layer Policy contained in the Special Report and 71 Advices, relating to inclusions, deletions, correction of spellings etc. and have made the following orders.

# Government Order No. SWD 225 BCA 2000, Dated: 30th March 2002

After careful consideration of the above proposal the Government are pleased to make the following orders:

- The quantum of Reservation Specified in G.O. Dated: 17-09-1994 and 31-01-1995 read at Sl. No. (1) & (2) respectively is continued for admission to Educational Institutions and Employment.
- The revised list of Backward Classes enclosed to this order as at Annexure-I, incorporating recommendations of the BC Commission, is brought into force with immediate effect.
- 3. A new comprehensive Creamy Layer Policy as detailed in Annexure-II to this Government order is brought into force with immediate effect. This Creamy Layer Policy does not apply to SCs/STs and Category-I of the Backward Classes. Candidates belonging to Category-II(A), II(B), III(A), and III(B) shall be entitled to reservation in the manner specified in the new comprehensive Creamy Layer Policy.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS! CHUNILAL AMARCHAND BODE 4

It is considered necessary to provide for regulation of admission and determination of fee in professional educational institutions in the State of Karnataka and

to provide for reservation of seats to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes in professional educational institutions.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgement in Islamic Academy of Education and others Vs State of Karnataka, reported in (2003) 6 SCC 697, sought to regulate admissions to professional courses through two committees, one for overseeing admissions and the other for approving the fee structure in professional educational institutions, pending enactment of appropriate law by the Parliament.

The Supreme Court in P.A.Inamdar and Others Vs State of Maharashtra reported in (2005) 6 SCC 537 has held that where there is more than one minority or non minority institution or similarly situated institution in the State imparting education in any one discipline then a single common entrance test followed by centralised counseling, or in other words, single window system of admission is necessary in order to achieve the twin objectives of transparency and merit. All institutions of the same or similar type, whether minority or non minority institutions will therefore be required to fill their seats through a single common entrance test followed by centralised counseling.

Further the Apex Court in the same judgement has held that the State can regulate admission by providing a centralized and single window procedure which will ensure fair and merit based admissions and prevent maladministration. If the admission procedure followed by the private institutions fails to satisfy all or any of the triple tests prescribed by the Court, the admission procedure can be taken over by the State substituting its own procedure. It is also pointed out that minority institutions will lose their minority character if there is more than a "sprinkling" of students from non-minority communities in these institutions. The Apex Court has also clarified that the minority students should be from within the State. Taking this into consideration the Bill provides for sixty six percent of reservation in minority institutions for students from that community within the State.

Whereas the population of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes exceeds fifty percent of the total population in the State. The Hon'ble Supreme Court in Indirasawhany Vs. Union of India reported in AIR 1993 SC 477 has held that the reservations made for all categories shall not exceed fifty percent. Keeping this in mind the State Government has issued orders providing reservation for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes to the extent of fifty percent under article 15(4) of the Constitution.

Article 15 (5) of the Constitution (as inserted by the Constitution (Ninety-third Amendment) Act, 2005 provided for making any special provision by law by the State Government for advancement of any socially and educationally backward classes of citizen or for the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes in relation to admission to education institution including private educational institutions whether aided or unaided, other than minority educational institutions notwithstanding anything contained in article 15 and sub-clause (g) of article 19 of the Constitution.

# THE KARNATAKA PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSION AND DETERMINATION OF FEE) ACT, 2006

(Received the assent of the Governor on the twenty fourth day of April, 2006)

An Act to provide for regulation of admission and determination of fee in professional educational institutions in the State of Karnataka and to provide for reservation of seats to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes in the seats in professional educational institutions.

Whereas the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgement in Islamic Academy of Education and others Vs State of Karnataka, reported in (2003) 6 SCC 697, sought to regulate admissions to professional courses through two committees, one for overseeing admissions and the other for approving the fee structure in professional educational institutions, pending enactment of appropriate lay by the Parliament.

And whereas the Supreme Court in P.A. Inamdar and Others Vs State of Maharashtra reported in (2005) 6 SCC 537 has held that where there is more than one minority or non minority institution or similarly situated institution in the State imparting education in any one discipline then a single common entrance test followed by centralised counseling, or in other words, single window system of admission is necessary in order to achieve the twin objectives of transparency and merit. All institutions of the same or similar type, whether minority or non minority institutions will therefore be required to fill their seats through a single common entrance test followed by centralised counseling.

Further the Apex Court in the same judgement has held that the State can regulate admission by providing a centralized and single window procedure which will ensure fair and merit based admissions and prevent maladministration. If the admission procedure followed by the private institutions fails to satisfy all or any of the triple tests prescribed by the Court, the admission procedure can be taken over by the State substituting its own procedure.

And whereas, in the Constitution (Ninety-third Amendment) Act, 2005, a provision has been made under article 15(5) as follows:-

"(5) Nothing in this article or in sub-clause (g) of clause (1) of article 19 shall prevent the State from making any special provision, by law, for the advancement of any socially and educationally backward classes of citizens or for the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes in RINCIPAL so far as such special provisions relate to their admission to educational institutions including private educational institutions, whether aided of GE, RAICHUR-584 103.

unaided by the State, other than the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30."

In order to achieve the above object and for the purposes hereinafter appearing it is considered necessary and expedient to provide for the following:

Be it enacted by the Karnataka State Legislature in the fifty-seventh year of the Republic of India, as follows:-

- Short title and commencement.- (1) This Act may be called the Karnataka Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Determination of Fee) Act, 2006.
- (2) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification, appoint.
  - 2. Definitions.- (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
  - (a) "Admission" means admission made at the admission centre;
  - (b) "Admission Centre" means the centre at which selection and allotment of seats to the candidates to various courses in professional institutions are made through the Common Entrance Test based on merit.
  - (c) "Admission Overseeing Committee" means the committee constituted by the State Government under section 5 for regulating the admissions in private unaided professional educational institutions;
  - (d) "Aided institution" means a private professional educational institution receiving financial aid or grant-in-aid from the State Government and includes minority and non-minority educational institutions receiving such financial aid or grant;
  - (e) "Common Entrance Test" means the entrance test conducted for determination of merit of the candidates followed by centralized counseling for the purpose of admission to professional educational courses through a single window procedure;
  - (f) "Common Entrance Test Cell" means the agency of the State Government which conducts the common entrance test;
  - (g) "Fee Regulatory Committee" means the Committee constituted under section 6 for determination and regulation of fee for admission to private unaided professional educational institutions;
  - (h) "Government" means the State Government;
  - (i) "Government seats" means all the seats in Government polleges, university CHAND BOHRA constituent colleges, such number of the seats in Private Alded Professional IUR-584 103. Educational Institutions as may be notified by State Government and such

and includes any other professional educational courses at undergraduate and postgraduate levels as well as super speciality courses as may be notified by the State Government in this behalf;

- (q) "Professional Educational Institution" means college or school or an institute by whatever name called imparting professional education or conducting professional educational courses leading to the award of a degree, diploma or a certificate by whatever name called, approved or recognized by the competent statutory body and affiliated to an university;
- (r) "Qualifying examination" means the examination as may be prescribed;
- (s) "Reserved seats" means the seats reserved in Government colleges, constituent colleges of universities, private aided and unaided professional educational institutions in favour of persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes as may be notified by the State Government;
- (t) "State Common Entrance Test Committee" means the Committee constituted under section 3 which conducts the common entrance test and makes admissions to the Government seats in professional colleges; and
- (u) "Unaided institution" means any privately managed professional educational institution, which is not receiving aid or grant-in-aid from the State Government.
- (2) The words and expressions used but not defined shall have the same meaning assigned to them as in the Kamataka Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1984 (Karnataka Act 37 of 1984) and in any other law for the time being in force.
- 3. State Common Entrance Test Committee.- (1) There shall be a State Common Entrance Test Committee consisting of,-
  - (a) Vice Chancellor of either Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences or Vishveshwaraiah Technological University, nominated by the State Government

(b) Director of Medical Education

(c) Director of Technical Education

(d) Director of Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy

(e) Three persons to be nominated by the Chairperson from among the Principals : Chairperson

shall be lawful for the university to levy such fine. The university shall not approve all or any of the admissions made to such institutions in contravention of the provisions of this Act or may withdraw recognition or affiliation to such institution under intimation to the State Government:

- Eligibility.- No candidate shall be admitted to a professional educational institution unless the candidate possesses such educational or equivalent qualification as may be prescribed.
- Allocation and reservation of seats. Out of the total intake of seats in a professional educational institution,-
  - (i) (a) in an aided institution, all Government seats shall be filled through the State Common Entrance Test Committee in accordance with section 3(6) subject to the reservation policy of the State Government; and
  - (b) the remaining seats shall be general seats.
  - (ii) (a) in an unaided non-minority institution fifty percent of the seats shall be reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes from the State as notified by the State Government; and
    - (b) the remaining seats shall be general category seats. Out of the general category seats upto fifteen percent may be filled by candidates belonging to the Non-Resident Indian quota:

Provided that where the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes in an unaided non minority institution are left unfilled due to non-availability of the candidates, or where students of reserved categories leave after they select the seats, the same shall be filled by the candidates belonging to the same category out of the merit list of the Common Entrance Test conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Committee:

Provided further that if seats are remain unfilled even thereafter, such unfilled seats shall be filled from the student belonging to general merit on the basis of merit through the Common Entrance Test conducted by the association of Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions.

(iii) (a) In an unaided minority professional educational institution, not less than sixty six percent of the seats shall be filled by minority students from within the State belonging to the minority community to which the institution belongs on the basis of interse merit in the merit list of the Common Entrance Test of the Association of Private Professional educational institutions; and

(b) the remaining seats shall be the general category seats. Out of the general category seats, upto fifteen percent may be filled by candidates belonging to the Non Resident Indian quota:

Provided that if any seats earmarked for the minority category in unaided institutions remain unfilled or where the students leave after selection of seat the same shall be filled by minority students of the same categories out of the merit list of the Common Entrance Test conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Committee:

Provided further that if seats are remain unfilled even thereafter, such unfilled seats shall be filled from the student belonging to general merit on the basis of merit through the Common Entrance Test conducted by the association of Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions.

- (iv) Admission to all seats in a private unaided professional educational institutions including reserved or general category seats but excluding the seats which may be filled by Non-resident Indian candidates, shall be made on the basis of merit by following the procedure of Common Entrance test followed by centralized counseling conducted in the manner as specified by the Admission Overseeing Committee.
- 10. Invalidation of admissions made in violation of the Act.- Any admission made in violation of the provisions of this Act or the rules made there under shall be invalid.
- 11. Fund of the State Common Entrance Test Committee.- (1) There shall be a fund of the State Common Entrance Test Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) called the Committee fund.
  - (2) The following shall form part or be paid into the Committee fund, namely:-
    - fee collected by the Committee for the purpose of conducting Common Entrance Test;
    - (ii) grants made by the State Government;
    - (iii) amount barrowed by the Committee;
    - (iv) all other sums received by or on behalf of the Committee from any source whatsoever.
- (3) Except or otherwise as directed by the State Government all money credited to the fund shall be invested in any Scheduled Bank.
- 12. Grants by the State Government.- The State Government may make grants to the Committee equivalent to such sums as it deem fit.

# UGC GUIDELINES FOR STRICT IMPLEMENTATION OF RESERVATION POLICY OF THE GOVERNMENT IN UNIVERSITIES, DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITIES, COLLEGES AND OTHER GRANT-IN-AID INSTITUTIONS AND CENTERS.

- Central Government has been issuing various instructions from time to time for implementing
  the Reservation Policy of the Government; and UGC being an autonomous statutory body,
  under the administrative control of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, is under
  directions from the Government to strictly implement the said instructions by all grant-in-aid
  institutions.
- Central Government, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Dept. of Secondary & Higher Education), vide their Order No. F.No.6-30/2005 U-5 dated 6th December, 2005 issued the following directions to the University Grants Commission:-

WHEREAS Article 46 of the Constitution states that, "The State shall promote, with special care, the education and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people, and, in particular of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, and shall protect them from social injustice and all forms of social exploitation.

AND WHEREAS, the policy of the Central Government is that in the Central Universities and Institutions which are Deemed to be Universities receiving grants-in-aid from the public exchequer, the percentage of reservation in admissions and recruitments in teaching and non-teaching posts is to be 15% for Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes.

AND WHEREAS, the University Grants Commission, New Delhi hereinafter referred to as UGC, is a statutory autonomous organization responsible for implementation of policy of the Central Government in the matter of admissions as well as recruitment to the teaching and non-teaching posts in the Central Universities and Institutions which are Deemed to be Universities:

And WHEREAS, the UGC has failed to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central Universities and grantee Institutions which are deemed to be Universities.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested under Section 20(1) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 the Government hereby directs the UGC to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central Universities and those of Institutions Deemed to be Universities receiving aid from the public funds except in minority institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution.

- 3 The instructions issued by the Government are statutory in nature, as per the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of *Indira Sahney v. Union of India & Ors* (AIR 1993 SC 447), since these instructions are issued for the purposes of implementing Constitutional [Article 16 (4)] provisions.
- 4. UGC with the mandate of maintaining the standards of higher education has been issuing guidelines from time to time, regarding adequate representation of teaching and non-teaching staff as well as of students [Article 15 (4), 16 (4), 46 & 253], belonging to SC/ST communities, in all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges, and other grant-in-aid or research Institutions and Centers. It has now become necessary to consolidate these guidelines, the following policy Guidelines are issued.
- All the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges, and other grant-in-aid or research Institutions and Centers are hereby directed to adopt these guidelines by appropriate resolution by the respective Governing/Executive Bodies/Syndicate/Senate etc. for effective implementation of these guidelines.

#### Coverage and Applicability:

- (a) Reservation is applicable to all teaching posts such as the posts of Lecturers, Readers, Professors, or by whatever other nomenclature the posts are known, and to all posts of non-teaching staff of all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges, and other grant-in-aid or research Institutions and Centers;
- (b) Reservation is also applicable to all admissions to Undergraduate, Postgraduate, M.Phil and Ph.D courses of educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above;
- (c) In the cases of reservations referred to in clause (a) above, the Instructions issued by the Central Government for grouping of posts shall be resorted to wherever applicable, especially when more than one University functions under a single Act, or several colleges function under one University; grouping of posts are mandatory if the posts concerned are transferable on an inter-university or inter-college levels. The practice of creating department-wise cadres, which tends to create single posts or cadres with artificially reduced number of posts in order to avoid reservation, is strictly forbidden;
- (d) In the cases of reservations referred to in clause (b) above, the Instructions issued by the Central Government with regard to reservation for implementing Article 16 (4) of the Constitution of India are strictly applicable to all central or any other special quota, permitted under any existing rules all the educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above, shall also apply to admissions of candidates to those Institutions.
- (e) Relaxation & concession in respect of educational qualification, age, experience and qualifying marks/standard etc. will be as per existing government rules in all cases of admissions, recruitments, appointments, promotions and other assignments of entitlements to the members of SC/ST.

#### Extent of Reservation:

- In all the educational Institutions referred to in clause 6 (a) above, the extent of reservation applicable is 15% for SC and 7.5% for ST;
- (b) Without prejudice to the provisions contained in the clause (a) above, in all the educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above, and functioning within any State shall follow the percentage of reservation prescribed by the respective State Government.

- (c) No restriction of percentage is applicable while filling-up of back-log/short-fall vacancies of SC/ST.
- Procedure to be followed in matters of reservation for teaching as well as non-teaching staff:
  - (a) Without prejudice to any procedure prescribed under various Instructions from the Central Government from time to time, the following guidelines are to be followed:
    - SG/ST candidates should be interviewed separately;
    - (ii) One member of the interview Committee shall belong to the SC/ST category;
    - (iii) All the SC/ST candidates selected according to their position in the combined general merit list shall not be counted for covering the prescribed percentage of reservation;
    - (iv) Rules of reservation are applicable both for direct recruitment as well as for promotion. If in internal promotion in feeder cadre candidates are not available, in that situation such positions be declared open and advertised in order to fill up the posts and fulfill reservation.
    - (v) The Roster, 40-point or 100-point as the case may be, shall be applied to the total number of posts in cadre only, (R.K. Sabharwal v. State of Punjab, (AIR 1995 SC 1371); cadre is best indicated by seniority list governing the members with the same pay-scale;
    - (vi) Total number of vacancies shall be calculated, and Roster as referred above shall be applied only excluding the back-log vacancies, if any;
    - (vii) Percentage of reservation shall be applied separately for each recruitment year, and not whenever the vacancies arise, or interviews take place, or recruitment/ appointment is made;
- Procedure to be followed in matters of reservation for admission:
  - (a) All the procedures prescribed under various instructions from the Central Government from time to time, as referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 8 above, shall be applicable mutatis mutantis to matters of admission of students referred to in all the educational institutions referred to in clause 6(a) above.
  - (b) In cases of admissions, sub-clauses (i) to (iii) of clause (a) above would only be applicable;
     and sub-clauses, (iv) to (vii) are not applicable;
  - (c) In cases of admissions, the following procedures are also to be followed:
    - No SC/ST student can seek admission or claim reservation, unless he/she appears
      in national or State/common or University/Institution tests held for the purpose, in
      order to avail the quota of seats reserved for them, by the educational Institutions
      referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 6 above;
    - In cases, where National or Common/State or University/Institution test is not prescribed as necessary for selecting candidates for admission, the SC/ST candidates seeking admissions, shall be arranged in the order of merit among themselves, as per the merit position obtained in the qualifying examination;

- (iii) Rules of reservation are applicable for under-graduate as well as post-graduate levels and research degrees;
- Percentage of reservation shall be applied separately for each academic year, and not whenever interviews take place, or recruitment is made;
- Rules of interchangeability among SC-s and ST-s are applicable, wherevernecessary to fill-up the number of vacant seats;
- (vi) In case no eligible reserved candidates are available, the vacant seats in the reserved quota shall not be filled by any non SC/ST candidates. Every effort shall be made to re-advertise for wider publicity in the leading national news papers;
- (vii) Advance special (short term) coaching with assistance from UGC may be introduced for prospective SC/ST students;
- (viii) In the Universities where central Registration for admission of SC/ST students has been introduced, all admission process must be completed at the central level itself, and the assigned Colleges, Institutes or Centers as the case may be only permitted to make attempts to fill in the vacant SC/ST seats, at their instance;
- (ix) All institutions referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause (6) should give the maximum possible encouragement and support to girls of SC/ST in admission.

#### 10. Annual Report:

- (a) All the Institutions referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 6 above shall submit reports about the implementation of these guidelines annually by 15th February of the following year in the prescribed format, attached to these Guidelines to the Deputy Secretary, SCT Division, University Grants Commission, New Delhi with a copy each to the Ministry of Human Resource Development or the Department of Education of the concerned State Government.
- (b) All applications for grant-in-aid, shall be accompanied by the reports on the implementation of these guidelines during the previous recruitment or academic year, as the case may be;
- (c) Reports as referred to in sub-clause (a) should assist UGC to re-adjust or reduce the extent of demand for grant-in-aid for the following academic year, at least in proportion to the deficiency in implementation of these guidelines during the previous recruitment/ academic year.
- (d) A separate chapter in the annual report published by the Institutions should be provided to explain the steps undertaken and the results accomplished for bringing the level of performance of SC/ST to general level during the year.

#### 11. Admission to Hostel Accommodations:

The percentage of reservation referred above under the head 'percentage' shall be strictly observed for admission to the hostels. Additional percentage of seats may be provided for the girl students of these communities. No rent shall be charged from the students of these communities;

Sub:- Implementation of Reservation Policy of the Government in Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other Grant-in-aid Institutions and Centres.

Sir/Madam.

This is in continuation to this office letter of even number dated 19.10.2020 and subsequent reminder dated 20.01.2021 on the subject mentioned above. As you are aware that the University Grants Commission is continuously monitoring the progress of implementation of Reservation Policy for SCs, STs & OBC, EWS and Persons with Disabilities in teaching and non-teaching posts as well as admission to all level courses in universities and colleges.

According to UGC Act, 1956, the UGC has to ensure effective implementation of the Reservation Policy in Universities and Institutions receiving aid from the public funds except in Minority Institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution. All centrally funded Universities/colleges/Institutions are required to ensure strict compliance of Government of India orders/rules on the reservation in their institutions. State Universities including its affiliated/constituent colleges and other Institutes functioning within the State should follow the percentage of reservation for SC/ST & OBC as prescribed by the concerned State Government

You are required to display the reservation roster which is to be updated at regular intervals on your web-site as per instructions issued by the Govt. of India, Dept. of Personnel & Training, New Delhi vide O.M. No.36012/2/96-Estt.(Res.) dated 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 1997.

You are also requested to fill up remaining backlog identified reserved vacancies under these categories in teaching and non-teaching posts. The UGC has circulated a letter No.F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 19-11-2012 to all Universities regarding Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Amendment Act. 2012 for compliance and necessary action as per the Gazette Notification 33. It is mandatory to furnish report along with statistical information in respect of teaching and nonteaching as well as admissions to all level courses and Hostel accommodation during the 2020-21 as per the prescribed format on the University Activity Monitoring Portal (UAMP) of UGC at following link https://ugc.ac.in/uamp/)

The above instructions should also be circulated to all the constituent and affiliated colleges of your university for follow-up action please.
